Her designs were edited so they could work with mother of pearl inlay. The result was a very striking design and fiddle.

Tree of life designs are very elegant on hardanger fiddles. This design features a single tree of life using white mother of pearl for the vines and gold mother of pearl for the flowers.

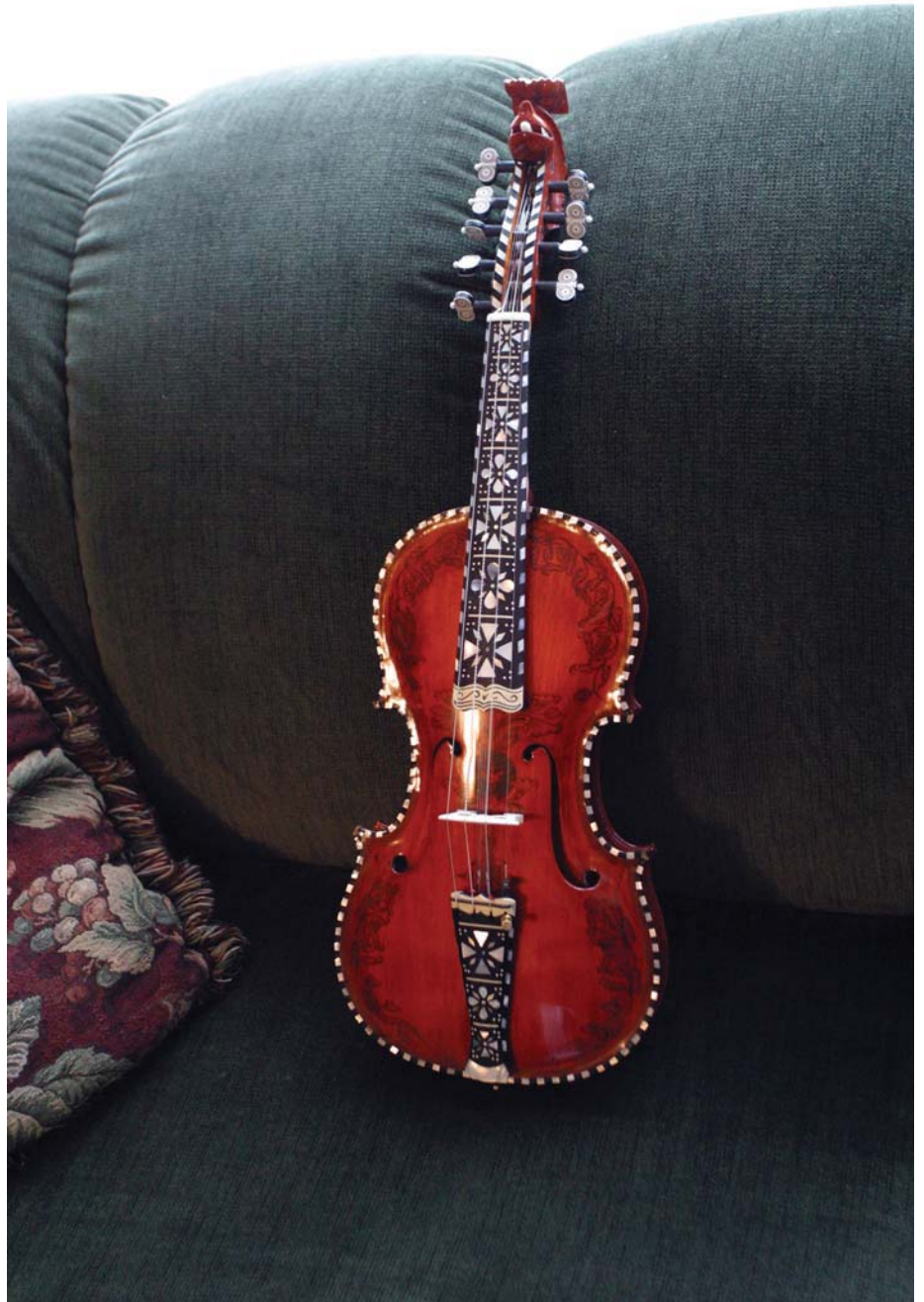


This fiddle features a very traditional geometric floral design on the fingerboard and tail piece.

Another fiddle featuring the traditional geometric floral inlay design. This fiddle also has hand made ivory laminated pegs.

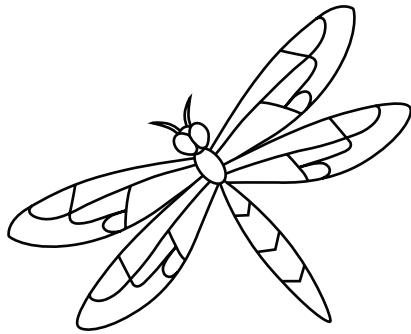

Custom Inlay

A single tree of life design was inlaid into the finger board and tail piece of this fiddle. Inlay vines are white mother of pearl and the flowers are gold mother of pearl.



The tail piece features a custom dragon fly design. the wings are abalone and the body is alternating pieces of white and gold mother of pearl.

This fiddle features a double tree of life design with white mother of pearl vines and gold mother of pearl flowers..

The chin rest was inlaid with the same vine design and also includes the customer's name.

A flying duck was inlayed onto the back of this double neck guitar/mandolin. Maple and walnut were used as inlay material.

The double neck is also a custom instrument.

The fingerboard and peg head on this mandolin were inlaid using mother of pearl and abalone.

The mandolin was also hand made. The back, sides and neck are Oregon myrtle and the top is red spruce.
